Purpose of a Youth Program

Short-Term Benefits

- Students feel a sense of belonging
- Free help
- Young, able-bodied help
- Student achieves volunteer hours
- Increase attendance and awareness of the organization

Long-Term Benefits

- Future membership
- Lifelong volunteers
- Future board members, donors or staff
- Develop advocates for the museum

Feel Like You're Not Ready?

- Start with student volunteers \rightarrow NHS, school organizations
- Build connections and trust
- Get students in the door
- Figure out what works, what students like to help with, what schools/organizations are willing to help

First Steps:

- 1. Identify possible organizations of interest
 - a. Local high schools and/or universities (special interest clubs)
 - b. Community groups (churches, 4H, foundations)
- 2. Reach out to organizations
 - a. Teachers, Guidance Counselors, Chairpersons/Board Members, Directors
- 3. Build rapport
 - a. Visit the organization or invite them to visit you!
 - b. What's in it for the student? (benefits, appeal)
- 4. Schedule your first meeting and spread the word

Ohio Graduation Requirements for the Class of 2023 and Beyond

In addition to fulfilling curriculum requirements and meeting the competency requirements listed above, students also must show they are prepared for their next steps after high school. State law created 12 diploma seals for students to demonstrate academic, technical and professional readiness for careers, college, the military or self-sustaining professions. Each seal allows students to demonstrate knowledge and skills essential for future success in their chosen post-high school paths. Students will demonstrate readiness by earning at least two diploma seals, one of which must be state defined. Seals help students develop an array of critical skills that are valuable to them as they transition to the next steps after high school. Schools should consider encouraging students to pursue seals that meet their individual interests and skills. Graduation planning will be an important step in supporting students in earning their seals.

COMMUNITY SERVICE SEAL:

Students will meet the requirement of the Community Service Seal by completing a community service project that meets the guidelines set by the school district board of education or school governing authority.



STUDENT ENGAGEMENT SEAL:

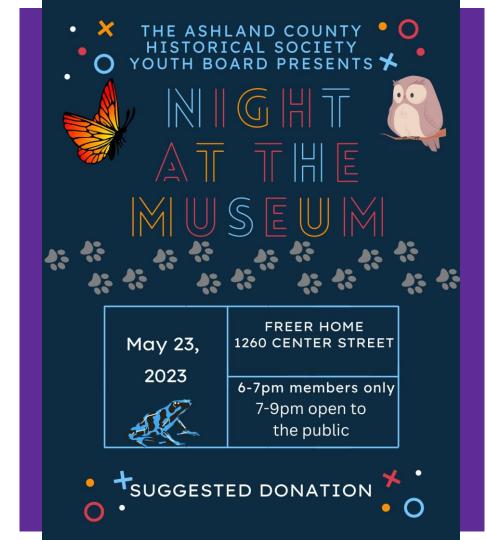
Students will meet the requirement of the Student Engagement Seal by participating in extracurricular activities such as (but not limited to) athletics, clubs or student government, to a meaningful extent, as determined by the guidelines set by the school district board of education or school governing authority.
